

Safety Risks That Often Result in Pediatric Amputations

One out of every 200 people in the United States has an amputation. Most of them are caused by complications of the vascular system, especially in patients who suffer from diabetes. However, traumatic amputations are another factor and are much more common in children.



Between 1990 and 2002, most of the traumatic limb pediatric amputations "occurred around 1 year of age with a steady decline seen up to 7 years of age." A 1996 retrospective study observed 74 patients under 18 admitted into emergency rooms with a traumatic amputation injury and found there were three major safety risks that lead to these cases.

Christmas Tree Vegetable Platter

Creamy Herb Dip

1/2 cup sour cream or crème fraîche

- 1/4 cup mayonnaise or salad dressing
- 3 tablespoons fresh chopped parsley
- 3 tablespoons finely chopped fresh chives
- 1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 small clove garlic, finely chopped

Vegetable Platter

- 3 cups fresh broccoli florets SAVE \$
- 14 grape tomatoes
- 1/2 yellow bell pepper, cut into strips
- 1 1/2 cups fresh cauliflower florets
- 3/4 oz (about 40) pretzel sticks (from 15-oz bag)

1. In small bowl, stir together dip ingredients. Cover; refrigerate at least 1 hour to blend flavors.

2. Rinse and thoroughly dry vegetables. Trim broccoli and cauliflower floret stems.

tomatoes to form garland. Arrange bell pepper to form star and cauliflower to form snow (see photo). If desired, cover and refrigerate up to 4 hours.

4. Just before serving, arrange pretzels at bottom of tree to form trunk. Serve with dip.
